Hearing of Citizens and Taxpayers –

Heather Wilmoth of Cummings Street asked the Council about her request to change the ordinance to allow residents to have chickens.

Gorske said that the Land Use Committee decided not to present an ordinance to the Council.

Viglione said that the committee made their decision based on the majority of the lot sizes being small which wouldn't allow for moving and repositioning the sheds, the waste disposal and how some residents already do not follow the rules to the letter.

Wilmoth also asked why the Police Department doesn't go out on foot patrol or bicycle patrol?

Lane said that in the past they have done both. At the present time the weather doesn't allow for it.

Morrow said that it is also a safety issue if only one officer is on duty at the time. During the week of the carnival they are out on the bicycle.

Gorske said that our incoming Chief Adamik said that he is open to any suggestions and the Council will talk with him about the foot and bike patrols.

Gorske said in reference to the request to change the ordinance to allow for chickens, he said that there was a situation a few years ago involving horses and what the Council thought would be easily resolved, took about two years of litigation.

Viglione said that the committee did not take the request lightly, they looked at several ordinances from different communities.

Wilmoth said she may get a petition together to present to Council requesting that the Ordinance be amended.
