

Minutes - June 15, 2015

Borough of Cambridge Springs

A regular meeting was held by the Borough of Cambridge Springs Council on Monday, June 15, 2015, at 161 Carringer Street. Report on 150th Anniversary Celebration -Delores Hale reported that a gentleman from Saegertown will be painting a mural of the Rider Hotel. There will be an oval frame around the painting. The cost is estimated to be \$5,000. Hale said that Betsy Robbins indicated that there may be an anonymous donor willing to cover the costs. Craig Newell Welding is making the ornaments now so that they can be sold at this year's Firemen's Carnival.

Report on Operations - Manager/Secretary Pude submitted a written report.

Hearing of Citizens and Taxpayers -

Steve Sebastian of 120 Brink Drive spoke to the Council about the problem the residents on Brink Drive are having during rain storms. He presented photographs to the Council showing the debris after the recent storms. He said about ten years ago the road was resurfaced and they should have put in curbs at that time. He suggested that the Borough use the street sweeper to clean the catch basins out. He has spoken with John

Dine on numerous occasions. He would like to have the debris cleaned and have false curbs installed.

Council agreed that the area should be cleaned up and the Borough Engineer will look at it to see what can be done.

New & Other Business -

1. Ordinance #814 - 2015 - Non-Uniform Pension Plan

Attorney Shaddinger said the Borough had received notification from the Pennsylvania Retirement System (PMRS) stating that the employees of the Non-Uniform Pension Plan were now allowed to contribute more than the set 3% to their individual pension plan. Shaddinger drafted an ordinance that was a little different from the model that PMRS had sent. The ordinance has everything that PMRS wanted but he also added a section that indicates who is authorized to participate in the plan. In the past it has been mandated that the full time employees participate. Elected officials, part time employees, seasonal employees are not allowed to participate. He was waiting on a callback from PMRS to get their opinion on that change to ordinance.

A motion was made by Lane to adopt Ordinance #814-2015. The motion was seconded by English. A poll vote was taken:

2. Resolution #568-2015 – Supporting Senate Bill #535 & House Bill #71 – Enabling Municipal Police Departments to Use Radar

English said that he has done a lot of research on this issue. There are three bills, two in the Senate and one in the House. The Senate Bill and the House Bill that the Police Committee are recommending say basically any local police officers with special training can use radar. The Senate Bill that they are not recommending just allows the local police in first, second and third class counties to use the radar. Pennsylvania is the only state that currently does not allow the use radar except but the State Police.
