

MINUTES – March 16, 2026

Borough of Cambridge Springs

A regular meeting was held by the Cambridge Springs Borough Council on Monday, March 16, 2026, at 161 Carringer Street. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Delores Hale at 7:00 p.m. The following members were present: Jennifer Howell, Amber Livermore, Randy Gorske, Jeremy Ball, Marci Dickson and Brian Harmon. Also present were Cambridge Township Supervisors Bernie Blystone, Keith Snow and Mike Porter. Also present were Kyle Ball, Kate Parkin, Tyler Pelton and Cindy Billingsley representing Little League and Little Gridders.

Recreation Discussion

Delores Hale gave an update on the improvements at the recreation area on Snow Alley. She said Phase 1 is almost complete. The restoration will be done when weather permits, and a sign will also be installed. Phase 2 involves the installation of the storm water management plan, then the basketball and pickleball courts will be installed. For Phase 3, she is working on a DCNR grant application for the installation of a new restroom and concession stand building.

Kyle Ball said the projects the Little Gridders would like to have considered are the widening of the entrance to the fields, the construction of a parking area, a sound system and a new concession stand building with an elevated announcers stand.

Tyler Pelton said the Little League would like to bury the electric line for the score board, he said that it would be approximately 125 feet to bury the line and may cost between \$1,000 - \$1,500. He also said that if the Little Gridders built a new concession stand, they could share that and use the existing Little League shed for storage.

Cindy Billingsley said Angie Mumford is obtaining a quote for the installation of Dura Edge to the one field at Stine which would help with the drainage problem and upkeep. She is estimating that it could cost between \$4,000 and \$5,000.

Delores Hale asked if they can get estimates on these items then submit those so that the Borough and Township can consider the requests.

Hale said all the property owners along Jackson Run are responsible for the retaining walls.

Pude said before he anchors the wall into the bridge, he would need to get approval from the Borough Engineer to do that.

John and Trisha Slayton said they will be opening a new business on Main Street. It will be Cambridge Kidz Playzone and will have an indoor playground and be available for birthday parties.

Delores Hale said she attended a preconstruction meeting for the demolition project at the former Nursing Home and provided an update on the project.

She has placed an order for 186 new military banners. This order was placed with a new company because the previous one has gone out of business.

Hale said she will be submitting a DCNR grant application for a new restroom/concession stand building, which will be Phase 3 of improvements at the Carnival Grounds.

Hale said the Borough will be presenting certificates to Gene Shearer and Richard Massung at an upcoming meeting to recognize their years of service to the Fire Department.


Adjournment
