**1. Request for a Handicap Parking Space at 135 Federal Street**

Pude said the Council would not need to make any changes to the ordinance to install a handicap parking space in front of 135 Federal Street, they would only need to install a sign and paint the space on the pavement.

Morrow said after the last meeting he was checking to see where the tenants were parking. He said the tenant that requested the handicap parking space was able to park in front of the house. The other tenant is parking in the driveway off of Prospect Street

It was also noted if the Borough installed the handicap parking sign and painted the space for the current tenant, in the future if they move, no one could park there unless they also had a handicap placard. The Borough would then need to remove the sign and cover the painting on the pavement.

Council decided not to grant the request for the parking space at this time.
