A regular meeting was held by the Cambridge Springs Borough Council on Monday, March 2, 2026, at 161 Carringer Street. Council discussed combining the residential LERTA with the existing commercial, setting a minimum dollar amount of improvements and setting the sunset provision at five years. Shaddinger will make some changes to the ordinance and forward to Council for review.

Nate Walczak said Firemen’s Parade will have a patriotic theme.

Pude said the Historical Society would like to have the Borough submit something to be placed in a time capsule that they will have sealed to be opened in fifty years. She suggested a letter from the Mayor written to the Mayor of the Borough fifty years from now.


Adjournment
