Chairman's Report — Bauer said Cambridge Township asked Auditor Rick Clayton to determine an estimated dollar amount that would be needed for CAJA to reach the 120% debt ratio 2021. At that time Clayton said it looked to be approximately \$20,000. Bauer said the Township Supervisors are willing to discuss making a "donation" from the American Rescue Plan Funds to CAJA before the end of the year to help meet the 120%. He asked if the Borough might also consider making a "donation" using their funds.

Hale said as a Borough Council member she thinks the Council may consider it as well but it would depend on the dollar amount.

A motion was made by Hale to request from the Cambridge Springs Borough and Cambridge Township donations using their American Rescue Plan Funding to help the Authority, if needed, meet the 120% debt ratio. The amount the Authority would request would be approximately

\$30,000. The amount would be divided based on the Trust Indenture pro-rata share amounts (Cambridge Springs Borough 93% and Cambridge Township 7%). The motion was seconded by Frazier. A poll vote was taken:
